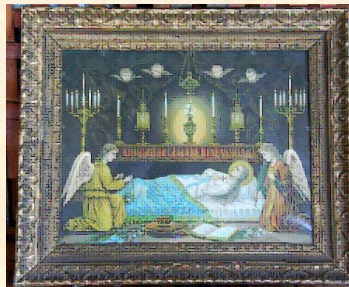

THE HOLY GRAVE OF MARY - ANTIQUE ORIGINAL CHRISTIANITY SERIGRAPH OR RELATED OLDER PROCESS PRINT - MARY SURROUNDED BY ANGELS, CANDLES AT AN ALTER - 16" X 20" - CIRCA LATE 1800'S-EARLY 1900'S - PRINTED IN GERMANY -Framed with a wide triple red matting and a

5" ornate wooden frame. This rare framed Victorian print shows a religious scene of the haloed Virgin Mary in repose in a cave (Ephesus?) attended by 2 angels, overseen by 4 cherubs, in front of an altar displaying beautiful candelabras and a glowing vase of sacred lilies. Clutching a cross to her heart, Mother Mary is draped in a blue cloak of stars. The print is loaded with vintage Christian iconography: incense censers, a crown, a holy book, rosary and discarded blue ribbon

This is rarely seen on a print from the original - at the bottom of the print is marked with "No. 530 GRAB DER HL. JUNGFRAU MARIA ~ IL S. SEPOLCRO DELLA VERGINE ~ EL S. SEPULCRO DE LA VIRGEN ~ HOLY GRAVE OF MARY" - Probably printed in Germany around the turn of the 19th century.

Some pieces are sets - 6 - 4 - 2 to the set. All are late 1,800's to mid-century modern. The oldest small collection is pictured above and is created by Fostoria - 1885! 2 small tumbler glasses and one sherry stem glass. The history of these pieces always will be a mystery that may become yours. The tumbler glass is in the pattern known as "Red Block" "Clear Block." The tumbler measures 3 3/4 inches tall by 2 3/4 inches in diameter. The tumbler is in excellent condition with no chips, cracks or damage. The sherry stem is 3" diameter x 5 5/8" tall and in the same excellent condition for 131 years old.

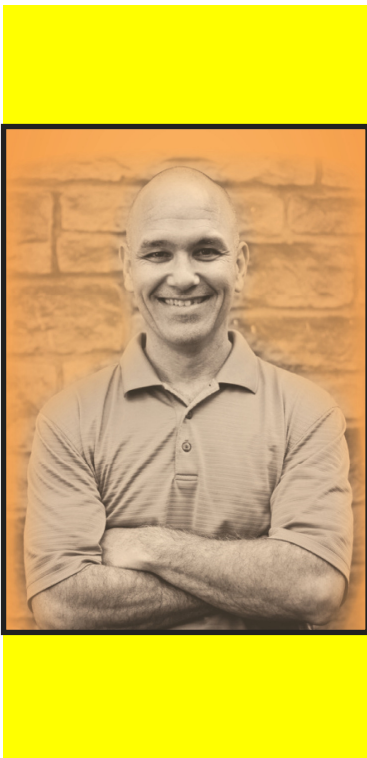
