THE CALL

The journey to this day began 13 years ago, when I heard for the first time the words of Jesus, "Follow me." Within the Church, I discovered a fountain of healing grace, a hidden treasure of truth and wisdom, and a sturdy refuge for the weak and brokenhearted. Most importantly, I found Jesus: friend, brother, savior. To be a priest seemed to be the natural response to this discovery. By the grace of God, I met Him when I was young, and He kept me close to Him in those early years, especially in serving at his altar. My faith was able to grow and thrive in the good soil of our little parish of St. John Nepomucene.

In 2014, I graduated from Ennis High School, packed my bags, and moved to Holy Trinity Seminary in Irving, Texas. My first four years of seminary mark one of the most intense periods of growth in my life. This first stage of seminary training focuses primarily on the human and spiritual development of the seminarian, helping him to grow in self-knowledge and the practice of virtue. The seminarian is taught how to pray, to listen closely to the words of Jesus, and to be a witness to His love in word and deed. In 2018, I graduated from HTS and the University of Dallas, and prepared for a new adventure.

In the Summer of 2018, I arrived at my new home, the Pontifical North American College in Rome, Italy. Known as the "NAC," the college was founded in 1859, and trains seminarians from all over the United States. The second stage of seminary training focuses on the priestly identity of the seminarian. In this stage, seminarians study theology in depth with courses covering a variety of subjects like the Sacred Scriptures, Church History, Morals, and Spirituality. Living in Europe for three years also provided me with the opportunity to travel to many different countries, including a one month teaching experience in Ukraine. One of the highlights of my time in Rome was meeting our Holy Father, Pope Francis in January 2020.

In the Summer of 2021, I spent a year in Dallas for my pastoral year at St. Ann in Coppell, and on April 23, 2022, I was ordained a deacon at St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church.

In the Fall of 2022, I flew back to Rome to begin a two-year cycle of graduate studies in Dogmatic Theology at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas.

On Saturday, May 20, 2023, I was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Dallas. God is good. Glory to Him forever.

Guidelines for the Reception of Holy Communion

We welcome our fellow Christians to this celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are not admitted to Holy Communion. Non-Catholic Christians may come forward for a blessing or prayer. Please cross your arms over your chest to signify that you would like to receive a blessing.

To my friends and benefactors, for your kindness and support. Thank you for your examples of holiness and discipleship. In countless ways, you have taught me how to love and serve.


To the musicians, thank you for your service to God in this liturgy and for raising our thoughts and voices to Heaven.
